Yoghurt Loaf

Ingredients

- 125g unsalted butter
- 250g granulated sugar
- 125g Greek yoghurt
- 375g plain flour
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 large eggs

Instructions

- 1. Allow the butter, eggs and yoghurt to sit at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- 2. Grease and flour a 2lb loaf tin. Set aside.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 140°C (fan assisted) or 160°C (conventional) or gas mark 3
- 4. In a medium-size bowl, mix together the flour, baking powder, and bicarbonate of soda.
- 5. Cream the butter. Add the sugar and beat until the mixture is light and fluffy. Add in the vanilla.
- 6. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating after each addition.
- 7. Add the flour mixture and yoghurt alternately, beating just until combined. Be careful not to overmix.
- 8. Pour the mixture into the prepared pan.
- 9. Bake for 60 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean.
- 10. Allow the cake to cool for 10 minutes, then remove it to a wire rack.

Wool: Double knitting wool Needles: Size 6 (5mm)

- 1. Cast on 44 stitches, work 18 rows in K2, P2 rib.
- 2. Work 30 rows in stocking stitch (1 row K, 1 row P).
- 3. Cast on 12 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows and change to K2, P2 (for sleeves).
- 4. Rib 22 more rows.
- 5. Next row (for the neck) rib21, cast off 26, rib 21.
- 6. Next row, rib 21, cast on 26, rib 21.
- 7. Work 22 rows K2, P2.
- 8. Cast off 12 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows.
- 9. Work 30 rows in stocking stitch.
- 10. Work 18 rows K2, P2
- 11. Cast off.

SEW UP THE SIDE SEAM

Beanie Hat

Cast on 64 stitches and work 14 rows in (K2, P1) rib.

Work 24 rows in stocking stitch or until work measures 11cm from cast on edge.

Shape crown as follows:

- 1. *K6, K2tog, Repeat from * to end of row (56 stitches).
- 2. Knit
- 3. *K5, K2tog, Repeat from * to end of row (48 stitches).
- 4. Knit
- 5. *K4, K2tog, Repeat from * to end of row (40 stitches).
- 6. Knit

Continue decreasing in this manner until (K1, K2tog) has been completed and 16 stitches remain.

7. Knit 1 row.

BREAK YARN AND THREAD THROUGH REMAINING 16 STITCHES
